Board of Christian Day School: Jerry Diener

Board met with Samantha Schnell and Emily Menz (we meet with at least one staff member a month), both had good things to say about this school year, the school, and the staff. They also shared with the board some of what they have been doing with their classes throughout the year.

Reviewed registration numbers and summer care. Most up to date information will be shared by Colett for Council.

Discussed a "before school starts" tuition increase to assist with increases of salaries. The majority felt another increase to tuition after the tuition cost had been communicated (which increased from \$900 to \$945), and parents registered was not something we should pursue. However, early planning and understanding of church/school salaries should be considered prior to sending out tuition costs next year.

Discussed the advantages and disadvantages of a closed campus (similar to this year's pick up and drop off with no parents in the school) for 21/22 school year. Also discussed the

possibility of having a pickup Friday at some interval where parents could come into the school.

After 43 years of teaching, Bonnie Jammer will retire after the 2021/2022 school year.

Board of Parish Education: Pastor Hemme

Sunday School wrapped up the year on May 23rd. Thank you to the teachers who helped during

this difficult year. The teachers were: Emily McMenemy, Stephanie Varner, Sarah Diener, Chris and Julie List, and Emily Menz. Classes will start up again in September.

Because of Covid restrictions and uncertainty with planning, there is a one-night Vacation Bible School scheduled for June 22nd. Registrations are due by June 13th. Hopefully, next summer we can do a regular weeklong VBS.

The fellowship team hosted the reception for Leroy Englehardt on Sunday June 6th. It was a great time to thank Leroy for his many years of service and to spend time with one another.

Board of Youth – Pastor Hemme

We had our first in person meeting this year on Sunday, May 23rd in the pavilion. The incoming 6th graders were invited. 16 youth attended, playing games, and discussing some summer activities.

The Youth Group has been helping out with a food distribution truck at Hope Lutheran Church in Rhodes. We plan to send a few youth on Monday June 14th. We are looking forward to getting back to more regular scheduled meetings and events this summer and fall.

Valley Lutheran Report Colett Dominowski

Valley held their graduation ceremony for the class of 2021. The first year with the new Director Dr. Petzold has come to a close. The growing campaign and the construction project has been completed. Valley had a good year in sports ending with one runner competing in track at the state level.

School Staff Report – Colett Dominowski

We have 81 paid registrations for day school. This is up from our 74 this previous school year. Preschool is full with 20 students and ten of them are there all day. We look forward to preparing for a new school year and getting back to having sports and events as long as regulations allow. There are no teacher staff changes for this year.

We had our last day of school closing chapel and awards on May 27th. The weather was cold, but we were glad to welcome families and members to celebrate with us outside. Thank you to TEAM for sponsoring the Kona Ice Truck for a sweet treat, the students loved it.

The staff will be attending an NWEA testing workshop on June 7-8 for professional development. NWEA is our standardized testing used at school to assess student achievement.

We are open for Summer Care this year. Ms. Lacie and Ms. Olivia will be taking care of students Mon-Thursday from 730a-530p. We have an average of five students a day.

We will kick off the 2021-2022 school year on August 19th for orientation and the first day of school will be August 23rd.

We want to thank everyone for their support and understanding this last school year. None of us would have ever thought or even thought to have planned for something like educating students during a worldwide pandemic. But we did it, all school year face-to-face.

Pastors' Report – Pastor Hemme/Pastor Menz

The pastors are grateful for a year of face-to-face education at Zion. Both enjoyed some - Ultimate Frisbee with the 7/8 class at the end of school and also after the year end chapel and awards.

Join the pastors for Bible Study on Sunday mornings after service. They are going through a study called Death, Heaven, Resurrection, and the New Creation.

Morning Prayers as well as Daily Prayers and Devotion at 11 continue Monday through Friday. -Shut-in visits for those in their own homes or apartments continue to go well. The pastors have now been able to visit all of our shut-ins in nursing homes.

Pastor Menz is teaching a one-on-one new member class that will be completed next week. Both Pastors are thankful for Leroy Engelhardt's many years of service to Zion as organist and are grateful to those who helped put together and attended his appreciation event on Sunday, June 6th.

Both pastors are excited to have a bit more normalcy at Zion with the change in our mask policy.

PPP Forgiveness Update - The PPP1 has been forgiven. \$20,000 will be placed in the General Fund. The remaining money will be placed in the Church Extension Fund savings account to collect interest.

Cemetery Easement – Representatives from Zion and Beaver Township met and discussed the cemetery easement proposed by Beaver Township.

Budget – Two options for the 2021/2022 budget were presented. Option one more closely aligned with Zion's goal of reaching 90% of district scale for the employees.
